Arrests Made in String of Convenience Store Burglaries

The Colonial Heights Police Department has made several arrests in connection with a string of burglaries to area convenience stores. These crimes took place during May and June of this year and caused approximately \$2000.00 in damages to the businesses as well as the loss of approximately \$4000.00 in merchandise. The Colonial Heights Police Department received several Crime Solvers tips, which aided in the resolution of these cases. As a result of this investigation, the Colonial Heights Police Department has charged a total of 4 adults and 2 juveniles in association with these burglaries. Additionally, these suspects are facing numerous charges in Chesterfield County for similar crimes. To date, the Colonial Heights Police Department has placed a total of 55 felony and 12 misdemeanor charges against these individuals. These charges include breaking and entering, grand larceny, conspiracy, possession of burglary tools and wearing a mask in public. The adults who have been charged are:
