COLONIAL HEIGHTS RECOGNIZED BY THE VIRGINIA RECREATION AND PARK SOCIETY FOR APPOMATTOX RIVER GREENWAY TRAIL PROJECT

The City of Colonial Heights Recreation and Parks Department recently received the “Best New Renovation/Addition Award” from the Virginia Recreation and Park Society for the Phase 3 construction of the Appomattox River Greenway Trail.

Over 350 delegates from around the state gathered last week at the 61st Annual Conference of the Virginia Recreation and Park Society held November 7-10th in Virginia Beach, VA. Highlighting each year’s conference is a formal presentation of awards.

This prestigious state-wide program honors individuals, agencies and organizations throughout Virginia who have demonstrated excellence in parks and recreation services during the previous calendar year. Judged by a jury of its peers, the Society paid tribute this year to the City of Colonial Heights as the best new Renovation/Addition as a trail for the

In development since 2009, the Colonial Heights Appomattox River Trail System (C.H.A.R.T.S.) greenway is designed to provide a continuous open space corridor along the Appomattox River from Roslyn Landing Park to the western city boundary. Phase 3 of the trail was constructed and put into operation during the Spring/Summer of 2014 as an extension to the previous 1.5 mile trail already in operation. This new section of the trail includes a $\frac{3}{4}$ mile 10’ wide paved, fully accessible walking trail with spectacular elevated views of the Appomattox River. The addition to this popular trail also includes a historic overlook utilizing a civil war era railroad line that has since been abandoned, as well as corresponding signage with information on civil war history in the area and how the abandoned railroad played a role in the war. The historic overlook is built on an old railroad abutment that once served as a bridge over the river. An ADA accessible pedestrian bridge was built from the paved trail up to the overlook area so that all could enjoy the view.



“This award is an important and gratifying recognition of the hard work invested by our Recreation & Parks Department and the C.H.A.R.T.S citizens committee in making the Appomattox River Greenway Trail something our residents can enjoy and be very proud of”, said City Manager Tom Mattis.

The Virginia Recreation and Park Society is a private, non-profit professional organization, founded in 1953 and incorporated in 1956.
