


8. Reading of Manner Addressing Council

ANY MEMBER OF THE PUBLIC ADDRESSING THE COUNCIL SHALL APPROACH THE LECTERN, GIVE HIS NAME AND ADDRESS IN AN AUDIBLE TONE OF VOICE FOR THE RECORD, AND ADDRESS THE COUNCIL AS A BODY RATHER THAN SPEAK TO ANY MEMBER. UNLESS FURTHER TIME IS GRANTED BY COUNCIL, ANY MEMBER OF THE PUBLIC SHALL ADDRESS THE COUNCIL FOR A MAXIMUM OF FIVE (5) MINUTES, REGARDLESS OF THE NUMBER OF ISSUES HE DESIRES TO DISCUSS. PROVIDED HOWEVER, THAT THE MAIN PROPONENT OF ANY APPLICATION, PETITION, OR PLAN THAT IS THE SUBJECT OF A PUBLIC HEARING SHALL BE ALLOWED TO ADDRESS THE COUNCIL INITIALLY FOR A MAXIMUM OF TEN (10) MINUTES AND LATER IN REBUTTAL FOR A MAXIMUM OF THREE (3) MINUTES.

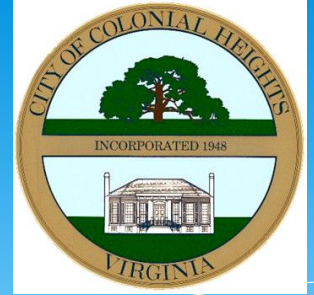

10. Advertised Public Hearing

- A. *AN ORDINANCE NO. 16-FIN-2 (First Reading) To amend the General Fund Budget for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2015, & ending June 30, 2016, to appropriate funds in the aggregate amount of \$1,276,001, which consists of \$700,957 in proceeds to the School System from the sale of the former City Courthouse, for the renovation of high school classrooms; \$450,044 for City Capital Improvement Projects; and \$125,000 from current and prior donations for the renovation and addition to the City Animal Shelter.***

To amend the Capital Projects Fund Budget to appropriate \$575,044 from General Fund transfers for Animal Shelter Expansion (\$225,000), Violet Bank Museum renovation (\$100,000), and Temple Avenue Sewer Line replacement and right-of-way acquisition (\$250,044); and to transfer \$500,000 from the Bruce Avenue Drainage Project to Temple Avenue Sewer Line replacement.

Transfer of Proceeds from Courthouse Sale and Donations

- The Finance Director is requesting the transfer of \$1,151,001 in proceeds from the sale of the former courthouse property to Kroger for:
 - ✓ Science lab and classroom renovations in Colonial Heights High School in the amount of **\$700,957**
 - ✓ General Fund Capital Projects –
 - a) Animal Shelter Improvements - **\$100,000 + \$125,000** donations received in support of project
 - b) Violet Bank Museum Upgrades (matching funds) - **\$100,000**
 - c) Partial funding of Temple Avenue Sewer Line replacement and ROW acquisition - **\$250,044**



 - ✓ Transfer from the Bruce Avenue Drainage Project to Temple Avenue Sewer Line replacement - \$500,000






City of Colonial Heights Zoning Map

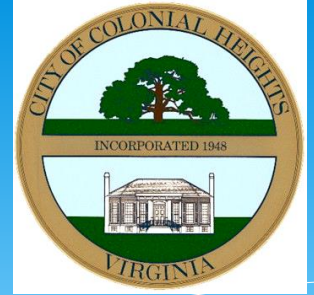

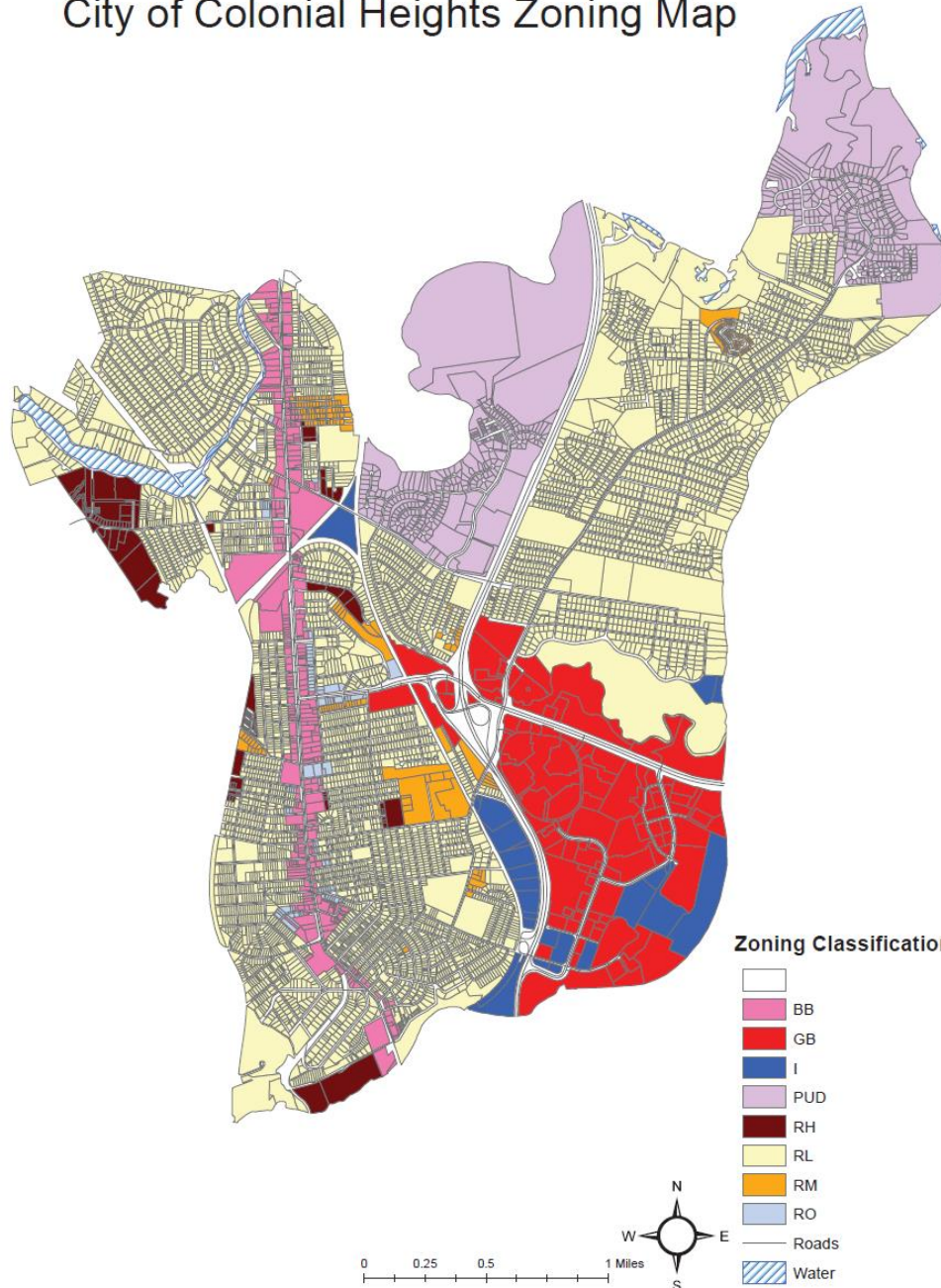



City of Colonial Heights Zoning Map



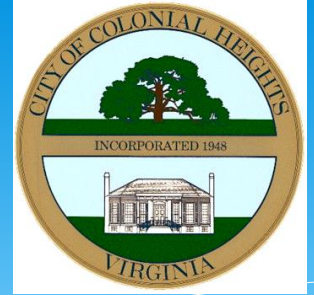

12. Consent Agenda

- A. AN ORDINANCE NO 16-FIN-1 (Second Reading)**
To amend the Capital Projects Fund Budget by transferring \$73,637 from Signal Coordination – Temple Avenue to Appomattox River Greenway Trail; \$58,392 from White Sands Court to Snead Avenue Storm Line (\$30,533) and Holley Avenue Project (\$27,859); \$9,105 from Highway Construction Fund (Local Share) to Boulevard Widening Project (\$1,100) and Snead Avenue Storm Line (\$8,005); \$112,554 from Utility Infrastructure Repair Project to Boulevard Modernization – Utility (\$68,423) and Danville/Lafayette Avenue – Utility (\$44,131).

Ordinance No. 16-FIN-1

Appomattox River Greenway Trail - Phase III has been completed and \$73,637 overage will be funded by transfer from Signal Coordination –Temple Avenue.

White Sands Court - has been completed with \$58,392 being transferred to Projects listed below.

Boulevard Widening Project - had been previously closed, but a reallocation of a project expense required a \$1,100 transfer from the Highway Construction Fund (Local Share).

Snead Avenue Storm Line – has been completed at an overage of \$38,538 that will be covered by the White Sands Court surplus \$30,533, and \$8,005 from the Highway Construction Fund (Local Share).

Holly Avenue Project - under the Urban Construction Program requires an additional \$27,859 that will be covered by the remaining White Sands Court project surplus.


Boulevard Modernization – Utility - has been completed and existing \$68,423 shortfall will be transferred from Utility Infrastructure Repair Project.

Danville/Lafayette Avenue Utility - has been completed and existing \$44,131 shortfall will be transferred from Utility Infrastructure Repair Project.

George Avenue Sewer Project - \$174,092 will be funded in the existing Utility Infrastructure Repair Project and no funding action is required.







2016 CITY COUNCIL GOALS

Public Safety

- **Complete final authorization and funding plan for the *Capital Region Radio Project*, upgrading the City's obsolete system and enhancing communication capabilities for Police, Fire/EMS, and other city operations.**
 - **Complete a meaningful and comprehensive review of security measures at the Southpark Mall, engaging mall ownership and the Police Department in an assessment of all policies and procedures to maintain a safe environment for mall visitors and the general citizenry.**
 - **Complete planning and construction of the Animal Shelter Improvement Project.**

Finance

- **Approve a new Five-Year Capital Program-Capital Projects for 2016, establishing Council's revised priorities for major capital improvement projects.**
 - **Continue on-going efforts to work collaboratively with the Colonial Heights Public School Board to develop an effective funding plan for future capital improvements supporting all city schools and facilities.**
 - **Approve a funding plan and authorize the issuance of debt to fund costs associated with the *Capital Region Radio Project***

2016 CITY COUNCIL GOALS

Planning and Code Enforcement

- **Working through the *Southern Gateway Land Use Planning Committee*, develop an effective land use planning strategy for neighborhoods adjacent to the Boulevard and Dupuy Avenue corridors in the area of the City Courthouse, recognizing the coming impacts of the enhanced roadways and new Virginia State University Multi-Purpose Center.**
 - **Determine final policy direction relating to the desired regulation of commercial vehicles, trailers, and/or storage containers in residential areas limiting one such unit per residential lot and requiring all to be placed behind the front line of the house.**
 - **Complete a review of fees for departmental services, assuring fee structure that provides appropriate cost recovery for services and reduces dependency on the General Fund.**
 - **Continue renewed efforts to assure proper maintenance and appearance of properties throughout the city, giving top priority to grass & weeds and inoperable vehicles; and providing a specific focus where needed to address these problems.**

Transportation/Mobility

- **Continue support of VDOT's Temple Avenue Interstate Interchange Project and the associated Hamilton Avenue road improvements as appropriate.**
- **Continue development of the Dupuy Avenue and Lakeview Avenue modernization projects - finalizing right-of-way acquisition and preparing for start of construction in 2017 - while striving to minimize adverse impact on existing neighborhoods and property owners.**
- **Continue on-going work to effectively access external funds and complete various road improvement projects.**

Water, Wastewater, and Stormdrainage

- **Complete construction of the revised Bruce Avenue Drainage Project, upgrading stormwater drainage and collections systems in the southwest quadrant of the city.**

- **Continue support of the project to help facilitate start of construction and, as final plans are developed, engage property owners on MacArthur Avenue adjacent to the southern boundary of the project to review final screening/landscaping plans for that area.**



Wal-Mart Foundation Grant


- The Office on Youth has received a grant in the amount of **\$2,500** and is requesting its appropriation for the Kid's After-School Program.
